
Complete the images below to discover three objects related to fire. Color the one that adults can allow children to interact with safely.

We hope this coloring/activity book encourages you and your family to discuss fire safety and burn prevention. The goal of the Fort Wayne Fire Department and the hospitals of Lutheran Health Network is to eliminate all fire and burn injuries and deaths. But to truly accomplish this, every family must continuously think about and practice burn prevention and fire safety. We encourage your family to visit the websites below to play fun safety games, color pictures and learn more about fire and burn prevention.

For additional information about local safety programs, call the Burn Center at St. Joseph Hospital at 425-3567 or the Fort Wayne Fire Department at 427-1483.

Remember the following basic fire-safety concepts:

- Test smoke alarms each month and change the batteries once a year.
- Install a smoke alarm in every room of the house.
- Set the water heater temperature to 120°F or below.
- Leave 3 feet of open space around space heaters and never leave them unattended.
- Keep matches and lighters out of reach of children, preferably in a locked cabinet.
- · Always remain in the kitchen when cooking.
- Draw a home fire-escape plan and practice it with the whole family.
- If a fire occurs, "stay low and go" and "get out and stay out."
- · Use caution when handling hot liquids.
- · Run cool water on a minor burn for 10-20 minutes. Do not use ice, lotions, creams or butter on a burn.
- Install a carbon monoxide detector if your house has gas appliances or a fireplace.
- Practice what you preach. Children learn by example.
